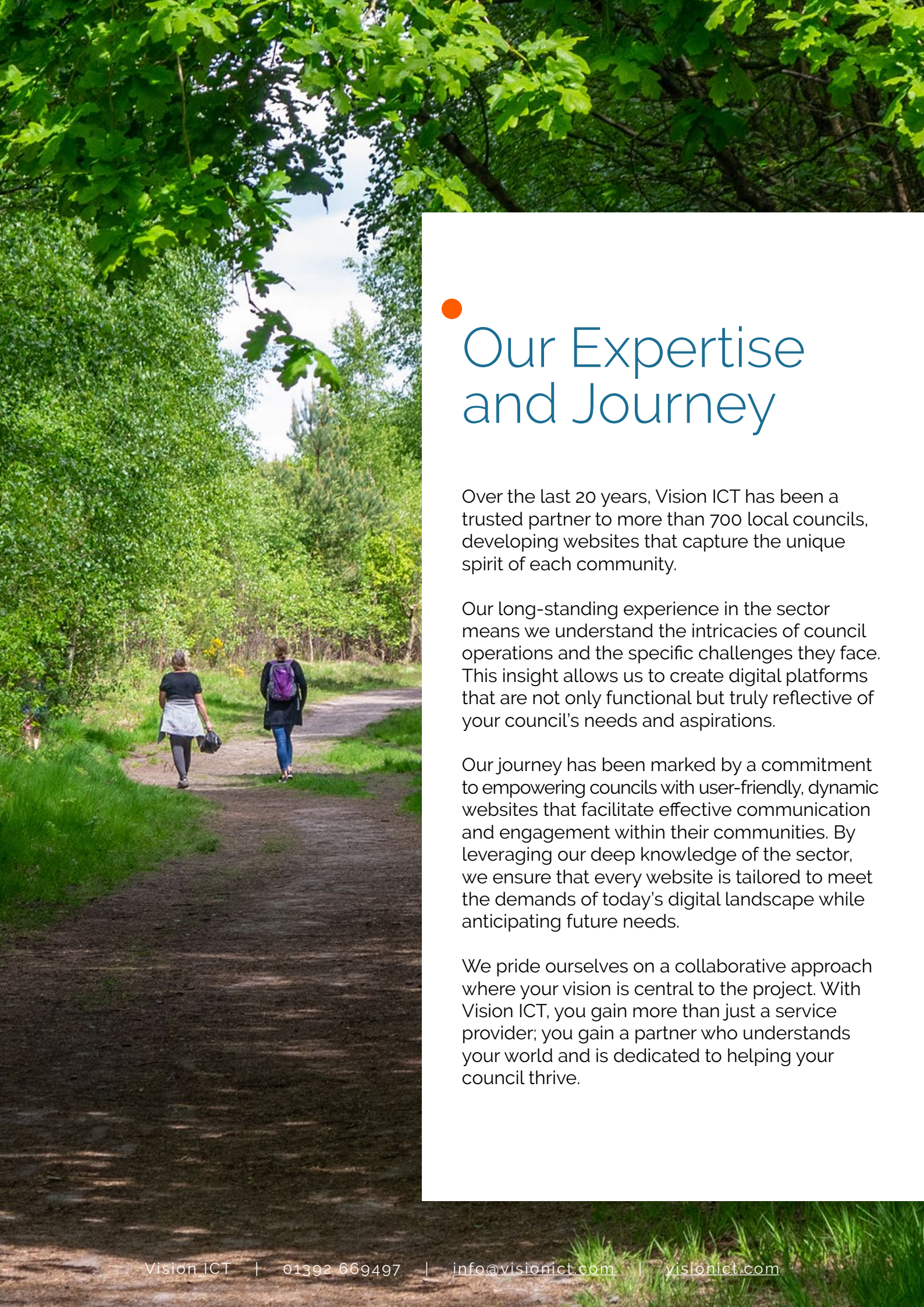

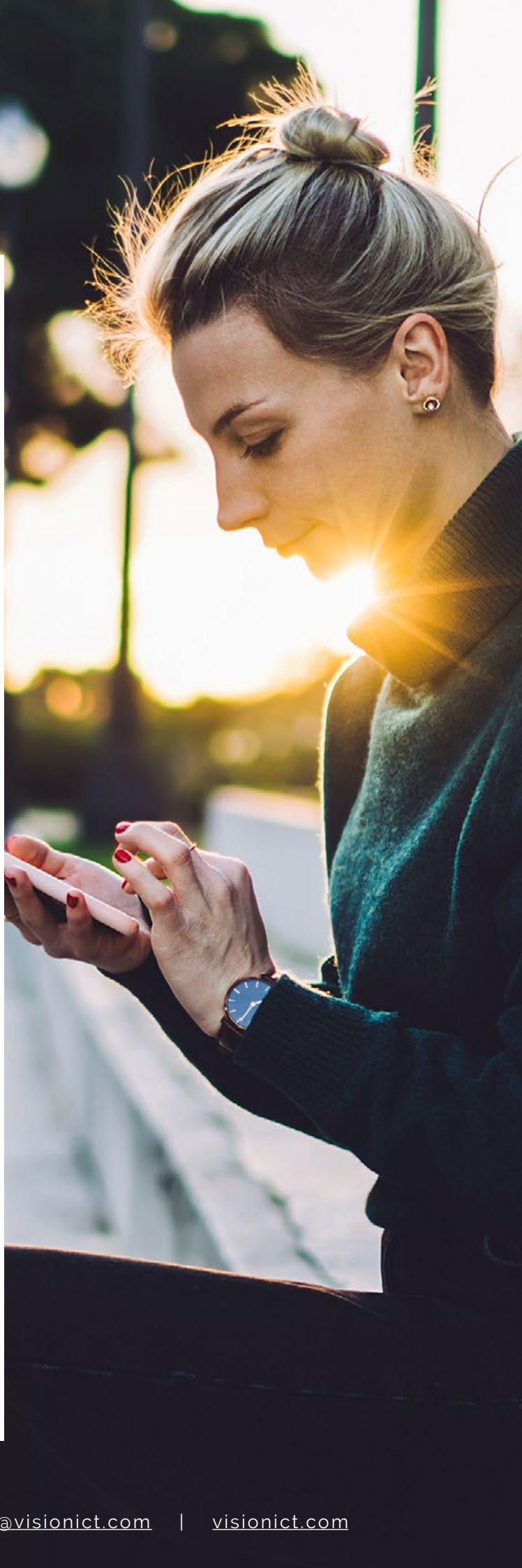

Geography – The village lies at 51 deg North, 2.077deg West in a valley between the chalk slopes at the western end of the West Wiltshire Downs, within the old royal hunting ground of Cranborne Chase. Winkbury Hill and Win Green (277m above sea level) are to the south. The Ebble and the Nadder, two of the five rivers which merge at Salisbury, rise in the parish. Berwick forms part of the Cranborne Chase AONB.

The civil parish includes Ashcombe Park, part of Ferne Park and most of Rushmore Park.

Salisbury is about 15 miles to the west and Shaftesbury 5 miles to the east.

History – The name 'Berwick' is derived from the Old English 'bere'-barley and 'wic'-farm or settlement. The village name and its site by running water both suggest an Anglo-Saxon origin. There is strong evidence of prehistoric activity especially on Winkbury Hill where there seems to have been an Iron Age hill fort. Winkbury Hill has been an SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest) since 1971.

From the 10th century Berwick St John was part of the estate of Wilton Abbey, but had probably become a separate parish by the 13th century. There has been a church (dedicated to St John the Baptist) in the village since the 13th century.

The village was designated a Conservation Area in 1975.

Statistics – The 2011 census records a population of 332.

Berwick is in the Parliamentary Constituency of South West Wiltshire. The Unitary Authority is Wiltshire Council, and the village falls within the South West Wiltshire area.

Berwick has an elected Parish Council of 6 members.

Village Life – Berwick is a thriving community. It has a Church, a Pub (The Talbot Inn) and a Village Hall.

A number of Berwick events are held throughout the year including Wassailing, Burns Night, the Berwick Big Breakfast, the Fete, Harvest Festival and Supper, Remembrance and of course Christmas with a biennial Nativity Play. During the winter there is a series of winter talks and regular pub and Village Hall quizzes. Most recently Berwick held its very own Bake-Off.

Berwick St John is famous for the biennial Country Fayre, a festival for steam enthusiasts which attracts entries and visitors from far and wide. From the first Fayre in 1992 this event has given more than £360,000 to local charities, primarily to the Salisbury District Hospital Stars Appeal. This year's contribution of £63,000 takes the total donated to date to the Stars Appeal to over £300,000!

Berwick is also known for its commemorative events. Jubilees, Royal Weddings and HM The Queen's 90th birthday have all been marked with village parties, pantomimes and pageants, along with commemorations for the 60th, 65th and 70th anniversaries of VE Day. Similar commemorations were held for the 11th November 2018.

Village Businesses – Farming and its associated activities is the economic backbone of the community. There are five working farms: Chapel Farm, Easton Farm, Cross Farm, Manor Farm and Upton Farm, some worked by generations of the same family. The workshops at Manor Farm currently house a picture framer, woodworker and an engineering company. Traditional Shepherd's Huts are also built there. The blacksmith and forge still operate from at The Cross which have been in use for many years. Several businesses are run from home offices, including holiday cottage rentals and financial services. Berwick also has a saddler and a goldsmith who work from the village.

Rudgwick is a village and civil parish in the Horsham District of West Sussex, England. The village is 6 miles (10 km) west from Horsham on the north side of the A281 road. The parish's northern boundary forms part of the county boundary between Surrey and West Sussex. Rudgwick Parish covers 6,394 acres.

Your council is made up of 11 volunteers who are elected or co-opted for up to four years. The next elections are scheduled for May 2027. The Parish Council meet on the second Monday of every month and is always keen to ensure that it reflects the wishes of the electorate and as such, all meetings are open to the public and include a session for public comments. Councillors work in partnership with local organisations, West Sussex County Council and Horsham District Council to preserve the essence of the area, and to protect the identity and character of the parish for the enjoyment of parishioners, visitors and future generations.

The Parish Council has statutory duties and powers to provide services for Rudgwick parish. Within these powers, the Council owns and manages the following facilities: Rudgwick Hall and Jubilee Hall, King George V building, Youth Centre, two playgrounds and a skate park and many areas of public open space within the village: King George V playing fields, Foxholes Copse and Churchman's Meadows, on behalf of the community. Updated Terms of Reference agreed at the Parish Council Meeting 13th May 2024

Rudwick Parish Council acknowledges that we all need to act on the causes and impacts of climate change as the current levels of global warming and projected future impacts require urgent action. As a result, it is our intention to take action, where we can, to minimise the effect of this.

1. Policy making – consider the relevance of effect on the climate and carbon emissions when making all future council decisions. When opportunity arises provide feedback on district and county council strategies for transport, housing as well as specific feedback on planning applications. This provides justification to treat climate change as a factor in future decision making.
2. Environment – to encourage action in this area.
3. Education – support all efforts to be made to inform and involve the whole community of this project. As part of this to engage local schools/children and youths in this programme.
4. Recycling – a commitment to continue to support and improve engagement and information in this area as well as support action already being taken.
5. Air Quality – a commitment to look at this and consider how the Parish Council can help to improve action in this area.
6. Liaison – to continue working with Horsham DC, other local parish councils and all environment groups (especially GGR) to support work on this subject.

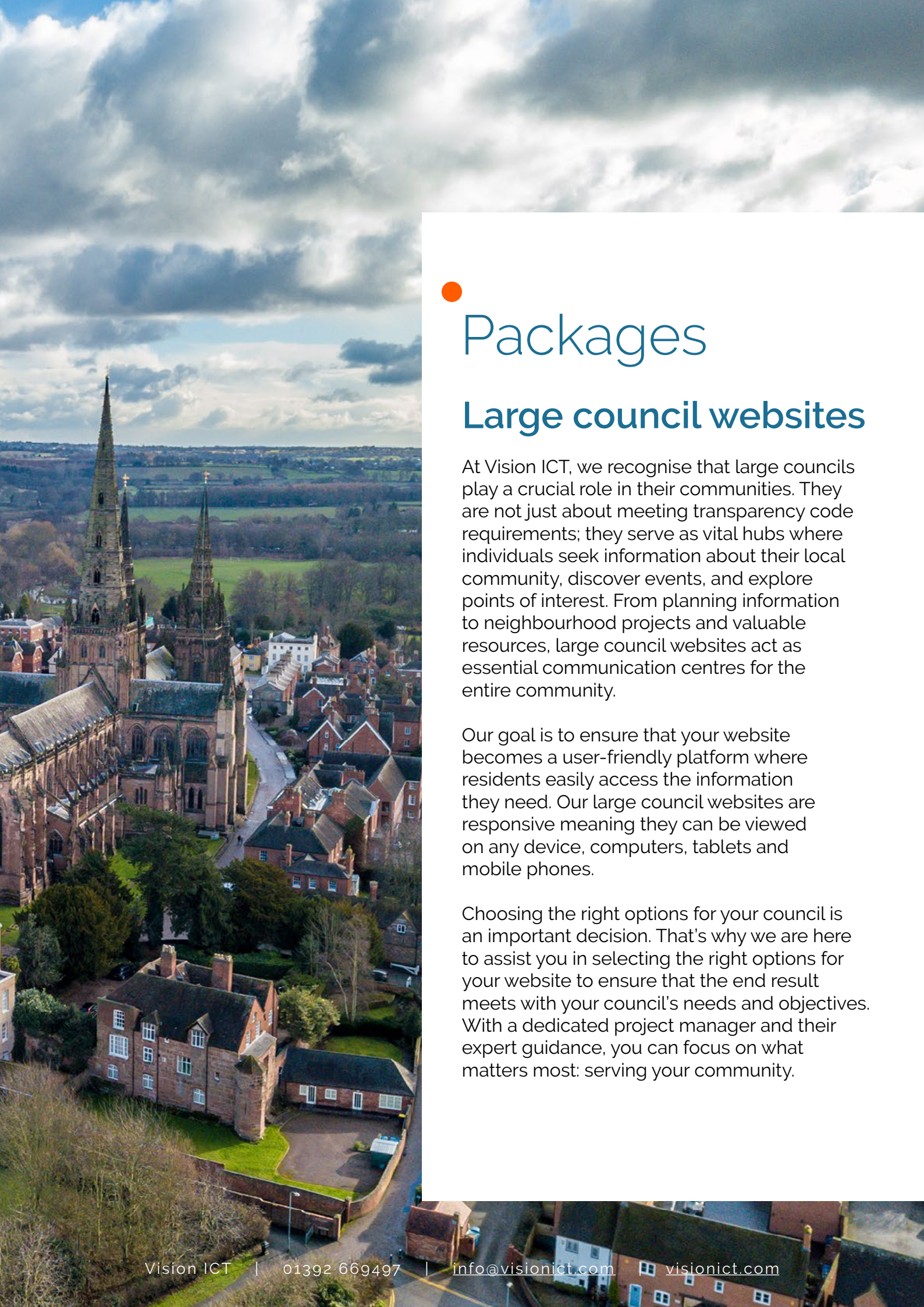

Our Cemetery is maintained as a Lawned Cemetery preserving the character of the Conservation Area and ensuring a tranquil setting for reflection.

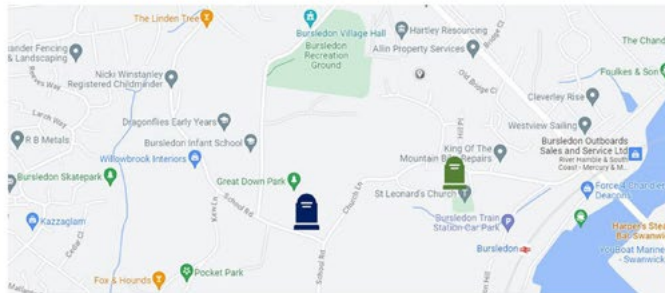

Welcome to Wickenby Parish Council

Wickenby is a hamlet and civil parish in the West Lindsey district of Lincolnshire, England. It is situated approximately 5 miles (8.0 km) south-west from the town of Market Rasen.

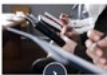
Wickenby existed at the time of *Domesday Book* of 1086 when it consisted of 156en households.^[1]

The parish church is a **Simestone** Grade II* **listed building**, dedicated to **Saint Peter** and **Saint Lawrence** and dating from the 12th century, although it was restored in 1868 by **George Gilbert Scott**. In the west wall of the south **aisle** is set a **brass** to Henry **Wolmer**, who died in 1429.^[2]

Wickenby railway station on the Sheffield and Lincolnshire Extension Railway, opened in 1848 and closed in 1965.^[3]

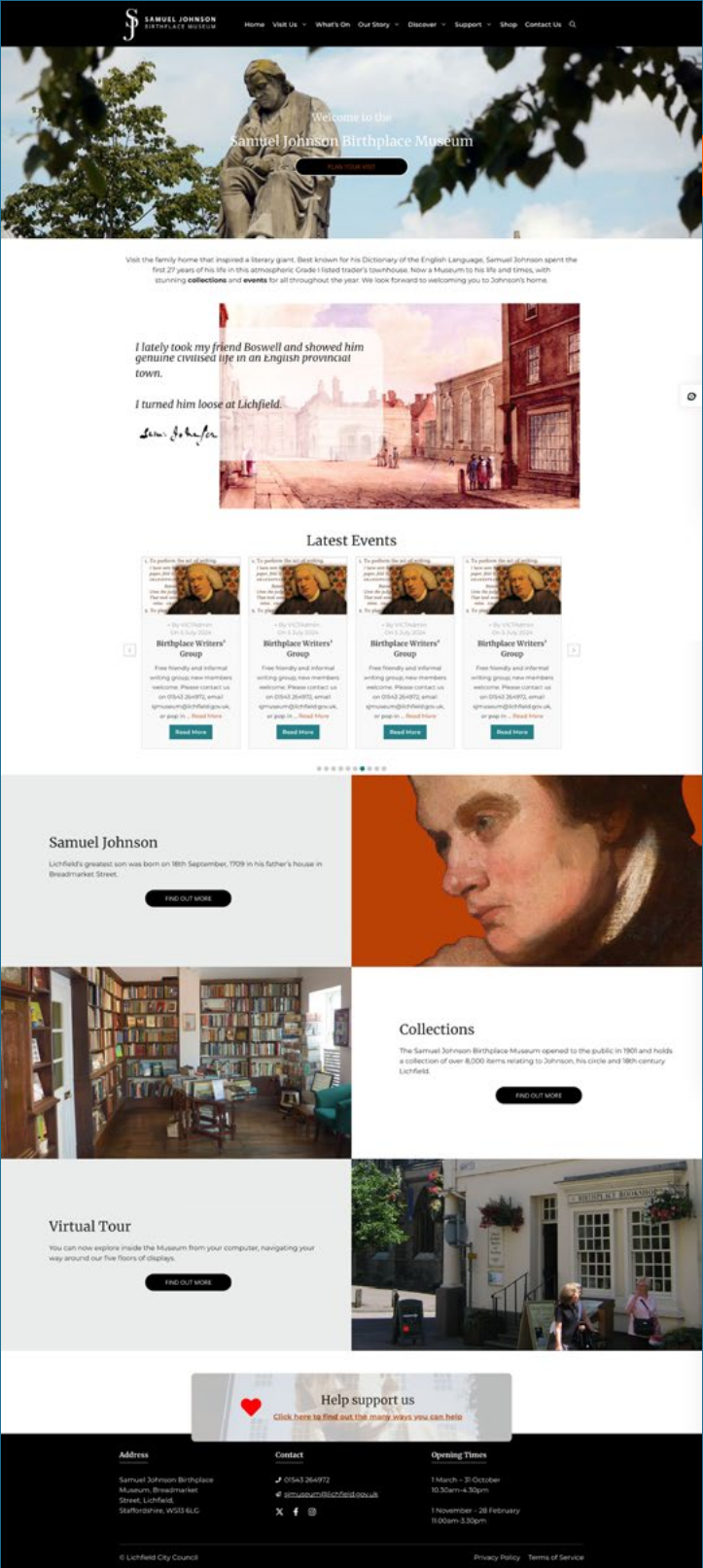

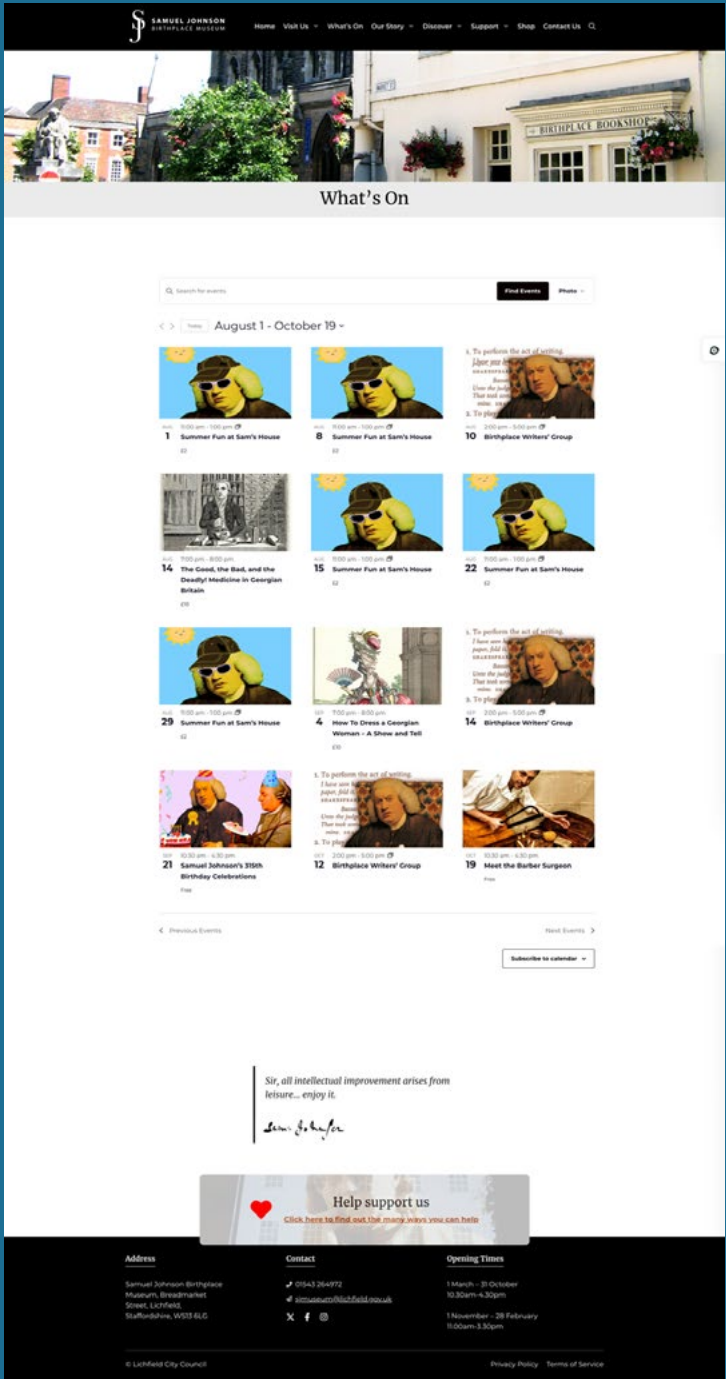

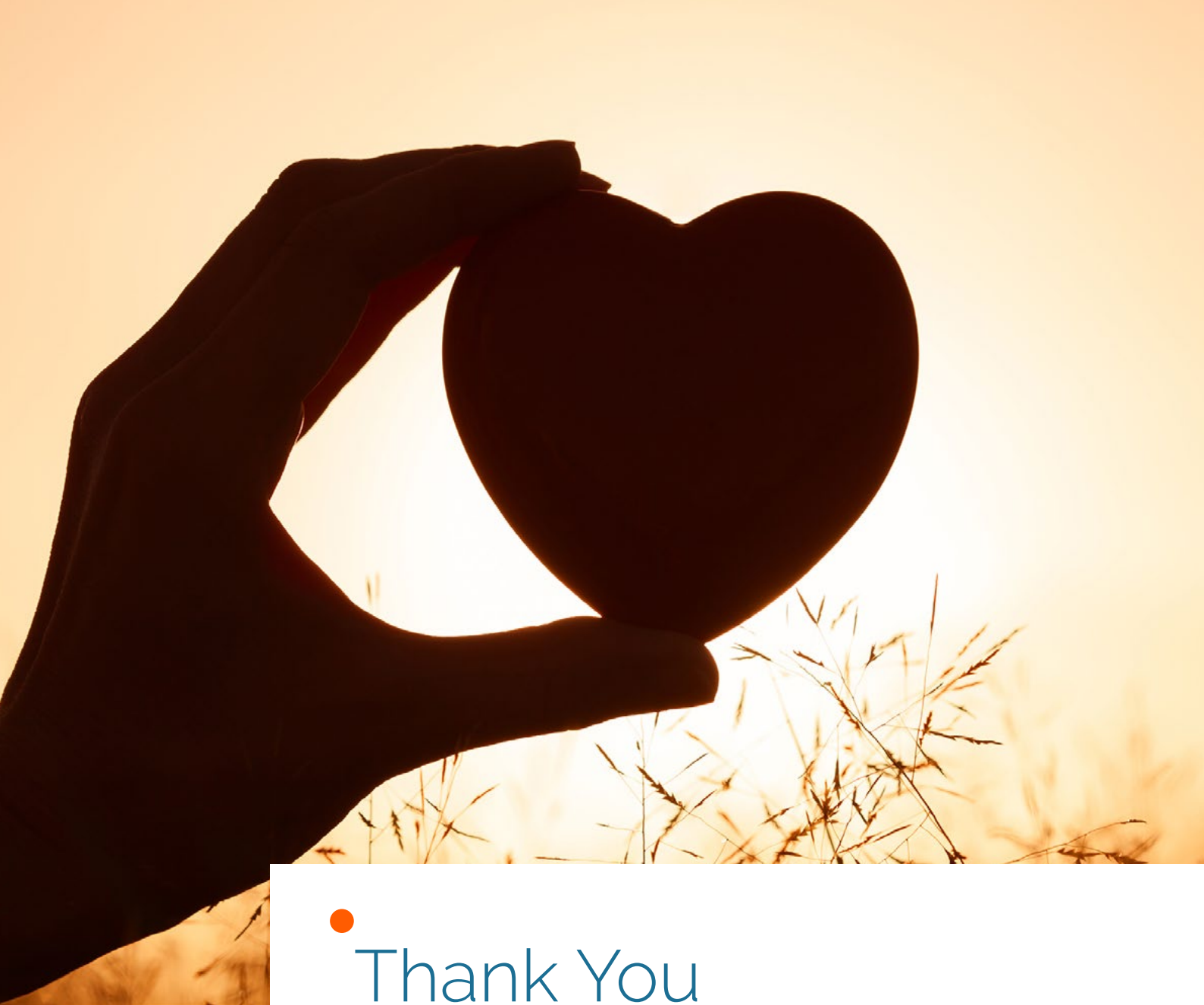
